# Despite summer storms, Roughrider maintains exceptional system reliability

Severe weather was the story of our summer here at Roughrider Electric Cooperative. We received a lot of much-needed rain in our service area, but with that rain came lightning, high winds, hail and even funnel clouds. It was an active weather pattern — and that meant a lot of activity at your electric cooperative.

No one likes it when the power goes out. It's an inconvenience for you, our members; and it's work for your cooperative to coordinate and complete the restoration process. That's our job, and we are happy to do it and serve you. We are glad those severe weather warnings have slowed, for now.

Because we had more severe weather events this summer, it may have felt like there were more power outages. We had a few transmission outages caused by lightning that resulted in more members being out of power at one time, but our co-op did not experience a larger number of actual outages.

The Member Satisfaction Survey we completed this past year indicated system reliability is very important to you. I'm happy to report that Roughrider still has an exceptional reliability rate based on SAIDI and ASAI, which are the System Average Interruption Duration Index and the Average System Reliability Index. When taking into account the total duration of interruptions and Roughrider's membership, our system's reliability rate is more than 99 percent.

Every year, our construction work plan includes making improvements that maintain and strengthen the system. As utility industry standards and technology evolve, we are able to make changes to the transmission and distribution system that can benefit Roughrider and its members. One of our ongoing projects is upgrading aged or compromised overhead power lines to include a static wire that was not a standard component when the line was first built. When lightning strikes, it will hit that wire and not the phase line that trips the breaker, which can result in power blinks or an outage.

When your power blinks, it means the system is doing its job in trying to clear the fault. When that's not possible, it will open a breaker to prevent a line from burning down. While those power blinks can be a nuisance for

you, they are preventing system damage and ultimately reducing the time of your outage.

Another ongoing project to improve system reliability is incorporating SCADA on our distribution lines. SCADA, or Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition, is a system of software and hardware elements that allows us to:

- Control processes locally or at remote locations;
- Monitor, gather and process real-time data;
- Interact with devices such as sensors, valves, pumps, motors and more through human-machine interface software; and
- Record events into a log file.

In the event of a power outage, SCADA allows us to open and close switches that change the source of your power and reduce your outage time. We use SCADA at all



of Roughrider's substations and many of the transmission lines we own, and are working to integrate it into the distribution system. We do share some transmission lines with other utilities, and do not have the authority to make improvements on those.

Maintenance is a key to system reliability. We've been trying to keep you up-to-date on the progress of our operations department. As we have shared in the local pages of *North Dakota Living* and on Facebook, and at your annual meeting, Roughrider's linemen have been busy building new services, completing substation and system improvements, and converting some overhead power lines to underground, to continue giving you safe, reliable and affordable electric service.

Maintenance can certainly reduce the number of power outages caused by storms, but it does not stop them. If you do experience a power outage, please call 800-748-5533 to report it. A dispatcher will ask a standard set of questions including, "Did you check your breakers?" and "Do your neighbors have power?" These questions provide helpful information for our linemen, who are trying to determine the extent of the outage.

Once we are aware of the outage, we use our meter-reading technology to verify you are out of power. That's when we roll with a line crew.

If you call to report your outage and it's not answered immediately, please continue calling. If we have a transmission outage, a larger number of people may be out of power and calling at the same time. Your call is still important, so we thank you for your patience and information.

Depending on the size of the outage, we may provide updates on our Facebook page. Please do not report your

outage on Facebook. While it's a great communications tool for our members, it is not a direct line to dispatch. We still need you to call 800-748-5533 and answer those standard questions, so we can log your information and ultimately give you the most efficient service.

It seemed like a lot of our severe storms happened during the evening and night hours. Roughrider always has linemen on-call who do their best to fix the outage in a timely manner. Know that it can take time to pinpoint the cause of the outage, load supplies, travel to the location and ultimately fix the problem. Our line crews might also be working on an outage that was called in prior to yours, depending on the path the storm took. Please know that we will work as efficiently as we can, with safety in mind, to restore your electric service.

We thank you for weathering those storms together with us and showing your support.

In the end, it was just another summer for your local Touchstone Energy® Cooperative. We did see more severe storms in our service area, and that weather pattern may continue into the fall and winter. As always, please be prepared for a power outage. If you feel you cannot be without power for whatever reason, you might want to look into how a portable electric generator can provide what you need during an outage. You will need a licensed electrician for proper installation, and for your safety and the safety of our linemen.

As the storms continue to roll, our line crews will continue to roll, and Roughrider Electric Cooperative will continue striving to provide you with exceptional electric service. ■

# Powering Up After an Outage

When the power goes out, we expect it to be restored within a few hours. But when a major storm or natural disaster causes widespread damage, extended outages may result. Our line crews work long, hard hours to restore service safely to the greatest number of consumers in the shortest time possible. Here's what's going on if you find yourself in the dark:

## 1. High-Voltage Transmission Lines:

Transmission towers and cables that supply power to transmission substations (and thousands of members) rarely fail. But when damaged, these facilities must be repaired before other parts of the system can operate.

## 2. Distribution Substation:

A substation can serve hundreds or thousands of consumers. When a major outage occurs, line crews inspect substations to determine if problems stem from transmission lines feeding into the substation, the substation itself or if problems exist further down the line.

## 3. Main Distribution Lines:

If the problem cannot be isolated at a distribution substation, distribution lines are checked. These lines carry power to large groups of consumers in communities or housing developments.

## 4. Tap Lines:

If local outages persist, supply lines (also known as tap lines) are inspected. These lines deliver power to transformers, either mounted on poles or placed on pads for underground service, outside businesses, schools and homes.

## 5. Individual Homes:

If your home remains without power, the service line between a transformer and your residence may need to be repaired. Always call to report an outage to help line crews isolate the issue.

## Roughrider Electric Cooperative offers members CONSERVATION AND ENERGY EFFICIENCIES INCENTIVES

**R**oughrider Electric Cooperative is continuing the conservation and energy-efficiency program. The incentives help you, the member, become more energy efficient.

The program for 2018 will include ground-source heat pumps and air-source heat pumps.

Members must buy and install qualifying systems between Jan. 1, 2018 and Dec. 31, 2018. The program for the heat pumps is for new installation or for replacement of a conventional heating system.

Roughrider Electric Cooperative personnel will check the

installation, and get the appropriate documentation and receipts. Once completed and approved, Roughrider Electric Cooperative will send a check directly to the member to help cover the purchase cost.

A maximum dollar amount has been set aside for the incentive program. The program will close when we meet this amount. Roughrider Electric reserves the right to cancel the program without further notice. One rebate allowed per member.

Required minimum efficiency

**\$150 per ton with a maximum rebate of \$600**  
CLOSED LOOP: EER >= 14.1 COP >= 3.3  
OPEN LOOP: EER >= 16.2 COP >= 3.6

**Air-Source Heat Pumps:**  
Required minimum efficiency

**\$100 per ton with a maximum rebate of \$400**  
HSPF >= 8.2 EER >= 12 SEER >= 14.5

## What are capital credits?

So, you like receiving those capital credit payments, but you're not sure why you get them. It's simple, really. Roughrider Electric Cooperative is a nonprofit business. We exist only to provide goods and services to you, our members; not to make a profit for a shareholder or investor. Cooperatives are operated to provide at-cost electric service to their members.

When all the expenses are paid, the cooperative's margins are credited to you in the form of capital credits. As the financial condition of your cooperative allows, you are paid these capital credits. In the meantime, your capital credits are your equity in the cooperative.

Refunds are allocated based on the amount of business a member does with the cooperative — the more electricity used, the larger the capital credit check.
